

To FEDERAL RESERVE BANK

There are Federal Reserve Banks in 12 U.S. cities: Boston, New York, Philadelphia, Cleveland, Richmond, Atlanta, Chicago, St. Louis, Minneapolis, Kansas City, Dallas, and San Francisco! This means no matter where you live, a Federal Reserve Bank tour is not far off! You need to make reservations in advance, leave your cameras at home, and bring proper ID... but getting a tour isn't a big problem. On the tour you get to see how cash is processed through the facility, the gold vault, and have time to explore the Bank's on-site museum. 2. UNITED STATES MINT

To LITERALLY see how money is made, head to Denver or Philadelphia's mint locations. Tours are FREE and will give you a new appreciation for the work that goes into creating U.S. currency.
